- The Centre Café to open and just sell a special - bacon/sausage sandwich with tea/coffee.
- There will be a raffle to raise money for the Trust.
- A Children's pumpkin competition is to be run where kids can drop off a carved pumpkin to win a prize.
- JH to re-advertise the event.
- The Terms & Conditions for table top hirers is to be approved at a Trust meeting.

Halloween

Unfortunately a DJ cannot be sourced at such short notice and that a lot of local pubs are having similar events on the same night therefore The Centre would not be holding a Halloween Party in 2021. Councillors agreed it would be good to have The Centre decorated for Halloween in time for the Craft Market and the carved pumpkins can add to the display for over the half term holiday.

Fireworks 6th November

- The music playlist had been received from Reaction Fireworks with a suggested theme of a salute to the NHS and Key Workers. Councillors agreed that this was an excellent idea.
- Glow sticks have been purchased and will be distributed by the Fire Cadets who have requested to help steward the event and raise money for their charity. Councillors approved the request.

Remembrance 14th November

- 10.00 am service at The Centre has now been confirmed as well as the service at the War Memorial from 10.45 am. Cllr Jones, Hannan and an ex serviceman will be doing the readings and will be sent the list of names in advance. Cllr Gregory suggested that a member of the Scouts could maybe do a reading as in previous years and Cllr Hannan said he was happy to stand down if this was arranged. Cllr Jones suggested that it would be a nice touch for local residents lost to the pandemic be remembered in the Service.
- Refreshments will be organised back at The Centre.

Christmas

- It was agreed that the Civic Service for 2021 be postponed and properly planned for 2022.
- A family Christmas party and the lights switch on is to be held on the 26th November between 5.00 pm and 10.00 pm in The Centre. The DJ for the party has been confirmed. Cllr Jones to switch The Centre lights on at the start of the event, caretakers/attendants to do other areas of Brinsworth at the same time. Cllr Buckley suggested that local Paralympics hero Gavin Walker be asked if he would like to assist at the event. Councillors agreed that this was an excellent idea. Cllr Gelder volunteered to play Father Christmas and a suit for him to wear needs to be sourced.

Queen's Jubilee

Both the Clerk and Deputy Clerk will be away on the weekend of the Jubilee so anything organised will need to be arranged for someone else to co-ordinate on the day.
