Once elected a Councillor will serve a four year term, unless co-opted or elected in a by-election when they serve until the next election. They must apply the law and comply with the Code of Members Conduct.

Cllr Jones commented "Having taken the role over during the 2020 Covid Pandemic, it was very hard to do a hand over. Most of the venues where our tins & poppies were dropped off were closed. As for many Charities the Royal British Legion struggled through this period to fund-raise"

Fast forward to 2022 most things have returned back to some kind of normality. Poppy Appeal starts well before November. PAO need to order their stock, Wreaths & School Packs. Then preparing the boxes of poppies and collecting tins with new serials. Then distributing to the schools,



shops, pubs etc as well as setting stalls in 3 supermarkets.

The whole process requires many volunteers for this to work. This year we were allowed to get out there and recruit new volunteers. We also approached all the Cadets in the local area.

As you can see we had help from the Army & RAF Cadets and the Scouts, which was amazing to see. We had over 30 other volunteers and would like to thank them all for their efforts. Which helped raise over £52,000 for our veterans.

Community members have been donating non-perishable goods that have been used to create emergency food parcels for people in the Rotherham area. In addition to this we have taken part in the Rotherham Christmas Toy Appeal for the 2nd year running. This aims to ensure that children and young people of Rotherham have a Happy Christmas by waking up to a Christmas present. We were overwhelmed by the generosity of our residents.

Active Regen

To Brinsworth Parish Council in partnership with Rotherham based Active Regen Community Foundation have found funded a support and physical activity programme. Which includes sports provision in the school holidays. A weekly youth club delivered in partnership with our Kidzone and a weekly chairs-based exercise programme to older people, all of which are held in the Parish Pavilion in Brinsworth.

The aim of the programme along with having fun is to provide a sustained programme. The sport physical activity is designed to improve mental & physical health. The programme of activity contributes to the Chief Medical Officers recommended activity levels which are:

For 5 to 18 years

At least 60 minutes per day across the week.

For 19 to 64 years

Aim to be physically active every day. Each week, adults should

accumulate at least 150 minutes (2 ½ hours) of moderate intensity activity.



Over 64 years

Each week older adults should aim to accumulate 150 minutes (2 ½ hours) of moderate intensity aerobic activity.

The programme in Brinsworth started in February 2023 and will continue until March 2024. To date the programme has

supported 153 participants aged between 5 & 81 years. Over this period, the programme has had 1465 visits to the various activities. All the programmes are advertised by both Active Regen and Brinsworth Parish Council on their social media sites. A spokesperson from Active Regen said "the strength of this programme is the partnership between Active Regen and Brinsworth Parish Council. The support from the Parish Council means that all the activities are free of charge and can be accessed by all. Without the support of the Parish Council, this provision would not be possible". Local parents said "the cost of activities for young people had become unaffordable and that the provision provided by the Parish was a Godsend.

Following the completion of the programme, we hope to have financial support in place to continue the programme into 2025. Visit the Active Regen site for booking and more info.

Christine Fundraising for HYPS

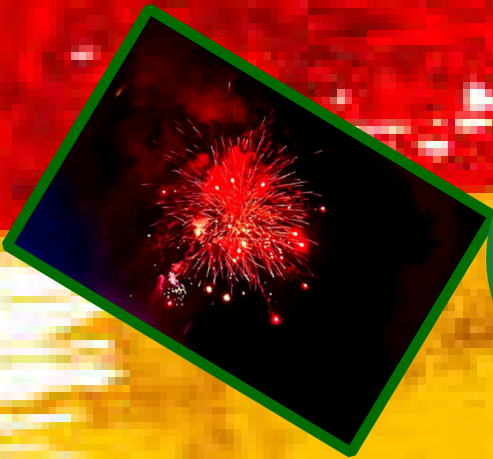

was set up by 1pm and there were over 50 Craft stalls. These were in the Pavilion, on the Bowling Green, in the Centre & Centre reception area.
