The Ordination took place at Treeton Baptist Church and was well attended by family & friends. The service was overseen by Bishop R E Thomas and was a very emotional Service. Elaine has become the Chaplain for Royal British Legion Branch for Rotherham, Parkgate & Rawmarsh and preforms at Military Services throughout the year. Well done Elaine.



Korean War

The Royal British Legion, in collaboration with Brinsworth Parish Council, the Mayor of Rotherham and local veterans, commemorated those who sacrificed their lives during the Korean War, which lasted from June 25, 1950, to July 27, 1953. This conflict arose primarily from the division of Korea following World War II. Britain participated in the Korean War under the auspices of the United Nations (UN) to defend South Korea after North Korea's invasion in June 1950. The war resulted in the deaths of over 1,100 British forces and left approximately 2,600 wounded. In contrast nearly 37,000 American soldiers lost their lives with an additional 92,000 wounded. South Korean forces suffered approximately half a million casualties. The Korean War marked the third largest conflict in American history with no decisive victory achieved by either side.

Sean Flannigan remarked, "Tony Wilson, a Korean War veteran, expressed his eagerness to attend the memorial noting that memorial services for the Korean War are seldom held in our region. We extend our gratitude for his presence." The photograph below features Tony's Korean War medal and certificate which was captured by photographer Ian Michael Spooner during this year's Armed Forces Day in Sheffield.



Parking On Pavements

It has come to our attention that parking on pavements in Brinsworth has emerged as a significant concern. For many years drivers have parked their vehicles partially on the curb and partially on the road: however, it has recently become increasingly common for vehicles to be parked entirely on the pavement.

While most individuals can typically navigate around these vehicles, it is essential to recognize that this practice can pose hazards for certain individuals and, in some cases, may even be life-threatening. Although parking on the pavement is not illegal and does not constitute an offense, the growing size of vehicles makes this practice increasingly problematic.

We kindly urge drivers to be considerate when parking on pavements, ensuring that there is sufficient space for pedestrians to pass safely without having to venture on to the road. This consideration is especially important for individuals with disabilities, parents with prams, dog walkers and both elderly and young residents.

Community Hub, Youth Club & Pantry

The Community Hub was established nearly three years ago supported by a grant from the National Lottery. Due to its success during the inaugural year the Trustees decided to extend the initiative. This continuation has been made possible through the contributions of local supermarket Community Champions, who provide tea, coffee and bread, while the Parish Council has committed to supplying sandwich fillings. A significant aspect of the Hub's operation is its reliance on volunteers, which substantially reduces costs.

The Youth Club operates concurrently with the Hub, commencing at 3:30 PM. We have recently welcomed a new Youth Worker, Jo Jones, Children arrive at The Centre at 3:00 PM, where they can enjoy sandwiches, biscuits, and beverages before engaging in activities at the Youth Club. The Club offers a variety of options including games, crafts, and PlayStation sessions, allowing the children to expend their energy.

Since May of this year, the Brinsworth Community Trust has introduced the Community Pantry, which operates from 3:00 PM to 5:30 PM. Additionally, the Pantry is available on Monday's from 5:00 PM to 6:30 PM at The Centre. We receive 125 kilograms of food from FareShare each of the day sourced from various supermarkets. Some items are nearing their expiration date while others still have good shelf lives.

Upon arrival, the food items must be priced before being made available for sale to residents, with most items offered at half price or less. It is important to note that the Pantry is not a food bank; it is accessible to anyone in Brinsworth and the surrounding villages. Each week, the volunteers generously dedicate their time to prepare sandwiches and hot

beverages at no expense to the residents of Brinsworth and sell the food in the Pantry.

None of the food that we receive at the Community Pantry goes to waste. Mel from Reyt Good Jams, pictured on the left, has surplus fruit & vegetables and turns them into Jams & pickles. All profits are given to various animal charities. Amanda from a local stable has received left over carrots & apples. She is pictured with one of the horses, Nigel, on the right enjoying his carrots.

"It is with great sadness that I share that Stephen Unwin passed away on Monday 15 July after a short battle with pancreatic cancer. Stephen joined us from Saudi Aramco in 2022 and brought a wealth of knowledge and experience that greatly benefitted our team. His leadership in safety programmes and his support of the regional SHEQ advisors drove significant improvements in RUI's safety performance during his time as Safety Manager. In May this year, he became Director of Operational Safety and Health for Global SHEQ, a role he was very excited to leave his mark on.

Stephen was keen to create a garden to create a space that brings everyone at the BOC site

together - from all the different teams and functions (whether it be office staff or those from our production site, transport and so on). The idea is that we can all help to shape the space into what we want it to be, with further landscaping and planting (which employees can volunteer to be involved in), and that we can all work together to care for it going forward. Tribute to Brett Walker By Hayley Walker

Where do we begin with Brett? Everyone knew Brett, you might have grown up with him, met him whilst he was working at the Working Men's Club, just from saying hello in passing or you had the honour of calling him a friend. One thing is for certain once you'd met him you didn't forget him!

Brett was born in Brinsworth and spent most of his life here. He loved it. He lived on Duncan street where he was born, to parents Mick and Jean with his older brothers Wayne, Dean and Shaun. He went to the Manor school where he met some of his closest friends, then on to Brinsworth Comp (as it was back then). Upon leaving school Brett started glass collecting in Brinsworth Working Men's Club, along the way Brett had various jobs.

Brett moved away from Brinsworth for a few years but couldn't bear to be away for too long. On return to the village he came with a new addition to his family by the way of his son Josh. Brett returned to working at the Working Men's Club behind the bar. Knowing all the regulars usuals he'd have them ready for them as they walked in! he didn't have the easiest of times when it came to his health and

after a car accident left his only arm broken, it never healed properly and he lost all movement at the elbow meaning that was the end of working at the Club. Not long after this he met his wife Hayley and they had two children Leland and Izzey. Brett and Hayley got married in 2011 in Treeton Church. Unfortunately Brett's health took another dip and he ended up having toes amputated and eventually having his left leg amputated below his

knee in January this year. Despite all this Brett always had a smile on his face and never let anything get him down. Brett's quote was "The main aim in life is to keep smiling." And that he most certainly did! Sadly Brett passed away at home on Wednesday 27th August.

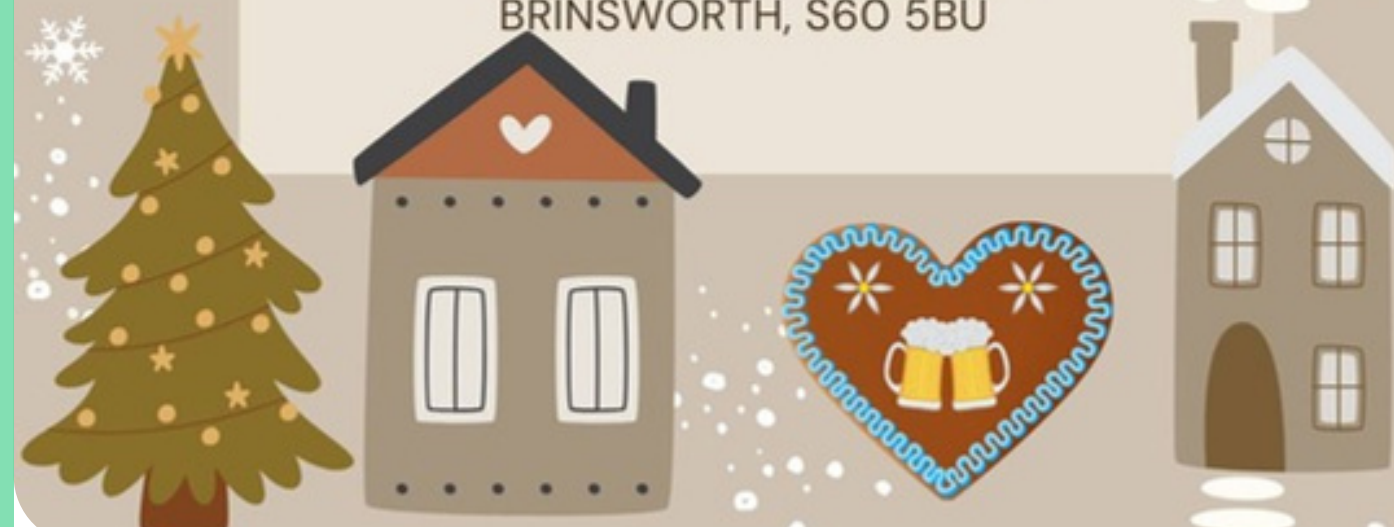
